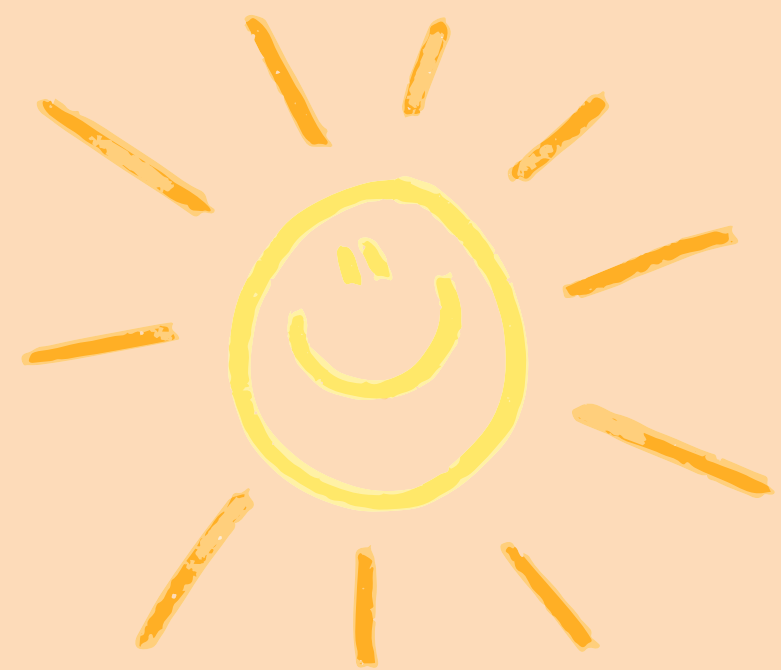

Dates of Significance

November is:

Adoption Awareness Month: November is Adoption Awareness Month in British Columbia and celebrates the loving families created when people open their hearts and commit to sharing their lives with a vulnerable child or youth.

Lebanese Heritage Month: Lebanese Heritage Month was officially designated by the Parliament of Canada in 2023 as a time to recognize and honour the contributions of Lebanese Canadians.

November 8: Indigenous Veterans Day - An important day of remembrance that honours the contributions of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people who participated in Canada's military efforts.

November 11: Remembrance Day - Canadians recognize Remembrance Day, originally called Armistice Day, every 11 November at 11 a.m. It marks the end of hostilities during the First World War and an opportunity to recall all those who have served in the nation's defence.
