

Parking Lot Reminder

Dear Parent(s),

Below is a map of our parking lot. Most of you are familiar with how it operates. Thank you for helping to keep the lot safe for our children. Instructions and expectations are listed below. Please make sure that you familiarize yourself, and anyone who will be picking up your child / children, of these expectations.



At Drop-Off (8:30 – 8:45am), traffic is to keep moving. Stay in the right-hand lane. Drop children off close to the front of the school, not along the sidewalk approaching the school. DO NOT PARK. Once child / children are dropped off, exit turning right.


At Pick-Up (2:30 – 2:50pm), traffic will line-up, single file. DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE. Once you have your child / children, pull into drive-thru lane and exit turning right.





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How to Help Us Be Good Neighbours - Parking Lot

When our school was built, the land surrounding the school was largely farm land. Over the last few decades, the neighbourhood has greatly changed with more houses, more apartments, and more cars. In our effort to be good neighbours, we ask that you please do the following when dropping off and picking up your children:

- please drop off and pick up in the parking lot only
- Do not park in "no parking zones" (anywhere there is a no parking sign or where there are yellow curbs)
- Continue to drive slow, even after your child has been dropped off or picked up
- Turn your car engine off if you are waiting at the end of the day this helps the environment too
- Do NOT block our neighbours' driveways at the end of the day. They need to be able to enter and exit at any time.
