TRAFFIC CONGESTION AT TOMSETT





Our school has nearly 500 students, including 68 new kindergarteners. Most families live within a 15-minute walk, with the furthest distance being 1.8 km. With over 100 cars using the parking lot daily, we appreciate the safe and careful driving.

To ensure smooth drop-off:

- Walk your children if you live within the Garden City Cambie No. 4 block.
- Do not park or leave cars in the drop-off area.
- Avoid staff parking; we have limited parent parking available.

Given the walkable neighbourhood design, we encourage ideas to promote walking to school, such as walking buses or parents supporting each other. We challenge families who drive to walk at least once a week. Senior students will soon initiate a Freedom Friday walk.

Breakfast Club is open to all students on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8 am to 8:30 am. Kindergarten, grade I, and grade 2 students should come with a caregiver; parents or grandparents are welcome. The focus is on providing a nutritious breakfast in a calm environment without playtime, promoting socialization. Food is provided by the school district, and students will check in with staff upon entering through the back gym door. Breakfast options include fruit, muffins, boiled eggs, cheese strings, and yogurt. The staff looks forward to welcoming students.
