

KEEPING KIDS HOME WHEN SICK

We have had a number of students who have vomited, experienced stomach pain, and feeling very warm with body chills at school over this last week. If your child is feeling unwell, please keep them at home.

If you and your spouse work, I suggest you have a Plan B in place when your child becomes sick (eg. making arrangements with extended family or your employer when these situations arise).

When children vomit at school, guidelines given to us by Vancouver Coastal Health require children to <u>stay home for a whole 24 hours before returning</u> (so missing the next school day). While many children may vomit for a variety of reasons, we are not medical professionals and through an abundance of caution, send all children home. We do not want to take any chances at making others sick.
