Dates of Significance

October is

<u>German Heritage Month</u> - A time to recognize the contributions German Canadians have had and how their heritage has shaped Canada's current social and economic fabric.

<u>Canadian Islamic History Month</u> – A time when all Canadians can learn more about the culture, contributions, and achievements of the Muslim community.

<u>Community Inclusion Month</u> – This month celebrates the valuable contributions that people with developmental disabilities make and recognizes the importance of communities where everyone is included.

<u>Latin American Heritage Month</u> - A time to showcase the richness and vitality of the Latin American cultures and heritage while reflecting on the contributions the Latin community have made to Canadian culture.

<u>Women's History Month</u> – In 1992, the Government of Canada designated October as Women's History Month, marking the beginning of an annual month-long celebration of the outstanding achievements of women throughout Canada's history.

<u>National Disability Employment Month</u> – An awareness month to promote employment inclusions for persons with disabilities and to celebrate the many and varied contributions of workers with disabilities.

October 17 – <u>International Day for the Eradication of Poverty:</u> This day presents an opportunity to acknowledge the effort and struggle of people living in poverty, a chance for them to make their concerns heard, and a moment to recognize that poor people are the first ones to fight against poverty.

October 18 - Persons Day: This day marks the historic decision in 1929 to include women in the legal definition of "persons" was handed down by Canada's highest court of appeal.


October 20 – <u>Installation of Scriptures as Guru Granth</u>: The anniversary of the day in 1604 when the Granth Sahib, the sacred text of Sikhism, was formally adopted at the site in Amritsar that became the Golden Temple.

October 20-21 – <u>Diwali:</u> A festival of lights and one of the major festivals celebrated by Hindus, Buddhists, Jains, and Sikhs. The festival usually lasts five days and is celebrated during the Hindu lunisolar month Kartika (between mid October and mid-November).

October 24 - Youth Climate Action Day: A worldwide movement of young people who are concerned about climate change and global injustice.

District Updates

City Centre Catchment Review-Public Engagement Now Underway

The Richmond School District is excited to be opening a new elementary school at 8671 Odlin Crescent in September 2026. This new school represents an important investment in our growing city centre community and reflects the district's long-term commitment to neighbourhood-based schools. It will provide students and families with enhanced opportunities for learning close to home while supporting enrolment growth in one of Richmond's fastest-growing areas.

To prepare for the school's opening, the district is reviewing nearby school catchments. This review will help determine the catchment area for the new school and determine the adjustments that are needed to neighbouring catchments in order to balance enrolment now and into the future.

Public consultation is now underway and includes an online survey and a series of open houses to gather feedback on two proposed scenarios for the new catchment area. Feedback gathered through this process will help inform the board's final decision, expected in November 2025.
